

## Notre Dame sticks it to lax opponents

Notre Dame Academy dominated the action at the second annual Mosby Cup boys' lacrosse tournament, held Saturday at the Middleburg private school.

The four-team tournament also included Benedictine, from Richmond, Christchurch, of Tappahannock, and Tandem Friends, from Charlottesville.

The Dragons (4-2) easily defeated Benedictine, 23-1, in a first-round game to open the tournament. Notre Dame then followed that up with a 20-1 victory over Christchurch, a first-round winner over Tandem Friends, in the championship game. Benedictine defeated Tandem Friends, 10-9, in the consolation game.

"We had an excellent week of practice in preparation for this tournament," said Notre Dame coach Rob Horne. "When this team plays with confidence like it did [Saturday], the potential is unlimited."

Junior attacker Devin Pinkston scored eight goals and dished out 10 assists to muster up 18 points in the two wins. Sophomore midfielder David Miller scored six goals and had four assists, and senior midfielder Dustin White won 12 of 17 face-offs. Senior Danny Shaughnessy, junior Dominic Banks and freshman Matt Miller led the Dragons defense.

Notre Dame will play at St. Johns College (D.C.) Thursday at 4:30 p.m.
